WHY Make Your Building Smoke-Free

80% of Ontario residents living in multi-unit buildings want to live in a smoke-free building.¹

Benefits:

- **Reduce the risk of fire**
Smoking materials (cigars, cigarettes and pipes) are the leading cause of fatal home fires.²
- **Save money on insurance and the cost of turning over a unit**
It costs 2-3 times more to turn over a unit that has been smoked in than a smoke-free unit.³
- **Protect your tenants**
Second-hand tobacco smoke is a health hazard, and it drifts from one unit into others.
