## **Benefits:**

- · Reduce the risk of fire
  - Smoking materials (cigars, cigarettes and pipes) are the leading cause of fatal home fires.<sup>2</sup>
- Save money on insurance and the cost of turning over a unit

It costs 2-3 times more to turn over a unit that has been smoked in than a smoke-free unit.<sup>3</sup>

• Protect your tenants

Second-hand tobacco smoke is a health hazard, and it drifts from one unit into others.
