Second-hand smoke and no-smoking policy options for condominiums

The purpose of this anonymous survey is to assess the level of interest among residents in having the choice to live in a smoke-free environment. Any future no-smoking policy that might be proposed for a declaration amendment, bylaw or rule could either apply to all residents immediately, or could grandfather (exempt) current residents. A no-smoking policy would not prevent smokers from buying or renting condominium units in the building and would not force anyone to quit smoking.
